

IRREGULAR VERBS – UNREGELMÄSSIGE VERBEN

Um das simple past, das present perfect und das past perfect zu bilden, verwenden wir bei regelmäßigen Verben einfach den Infinitiv (z.B. „call“) und hängen „ed“ an. (simple past: called, present perfect: have/has called, past perfect: had called). Die sogenannten „starken“ Verben jedoch bilden eigene Formen aus (z.B. take – took – taken).

Diese Formen musst du lernen.

Die folgenden Folien sollen dir dabei helfen. Zunächst wird das deutsche Verb genannt, auf der nächsten Folie folgt der Infinitiv und auf der dritten Folie dann jeweils noch simple past und past participle.

WIE DU MIT DEN FOLIEN LERNEN KANNST:

1. **Schriftlich:** Nimm dir ein Blatt Papier, lege eine Tabelle an. Lese das deutsche Verb, notiere den Infinitiv, überprüfe mit Hilfe der nächsten Folie, ob du das richtige englische Verb geschrieben hast und notiere dann das simple past und das past participle dazu. Überprüfe mit Hilfe der nächsten Folie.
2. **Mündlich:** Lese das deutsche Verb, spreche die drei Formen des dazugehörigen englischen Verbs aus, überprüfe mit den folgenden Folien!
3. **Weiterführend:** Überlege dir zu jedem Verb jeweils einen sinnvollen Satz im simple past und im present perfect/past perfect.

(Beispiel: „sein“ – Infinitiv: **to be** – Satz im simple past: My aunt **was** here *yesterday*. Satz im present perfect: I have never **been** to India.)

Dabei kannst du auch gleich die signal words für die Zeiten wiederholen und verwenden.
